

## The Life of **Christina Dozier**

Christina (Krisel) Dozier was Born August 5, 1920 to the Union of William Krisel Sr. and Claudetta Krisel in Nashville, TN. She was the youngest of five children, one sister Helen, three brothers, William Jr., John, and Claude.

Christina is well remembered as the first friendly face seen when entering Mt Clemens Savings(Huntington) Bank downtown Mt. Clemens, where for 25 years Christina held the keys to the Vault allowing access to the security lockboxes. In addition Christina truly enjoyed gardening, sewing , traveling everywhere her atlas would guide her and most of all , spending time with family.

Christina was preceded in death by her Parents; Husband Robert Sr.; Sons Robert Jr and Kenneth Sister Helen; and Brothers William Jr and John.
